ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2022

Decision to Change Association Management Firms

To provide better financial positioning and enhanced services for members, ASATT leaders made the decision to part ways with AEG, who had provided association management services to ASATT since 2007.

Founded in 1986, ARC is an accredited, full-service association management company that provides comprehensive, cost effective services to nearly two dozen non-profit organizations, many of which affiliated with anesthesiology. Transition began in late 2022.





Annual Conference Back In-Person

Due to the success of the Virtual meetings ASATT continued providing education through regular webinars (now quarterly) conducted by Regions. In addition. ASATT brought back the in-person Annual Conference and Anesthesia Tech Expo, held August 10-12, 2022 in Fort Worth, Texas.

Transition to New Certification Testing Provider



As a cost-savings measure for ASATT, and to streamline the testing process and provide more prompt and efficient testing for those taking the Credentialing Exam, ASATT made a change to the service provide who proctors the Credentialing Exam. In 2022 ASATT moved from the former provider (Scantron) to working with Meazure Learning.

ASATT continues to acknowledge that growth can only be achieved if it continues to provide its members with value and benefits necessary to advance their knowledge through education, certification, networking, and more.

The decision ASATT made in 2021 to provide additional discount for these benefits to individuals who join for a two-year period was well received. More than half (56%) of ASATT members in 2022 enjoyed the additional financial savings of the new two-year membership rate.



While there is a slight (~3%) decrease in the reported member numbers in 2022 as compared to 2021, it is believed that in the signficant data clean up during ASATT's migration to a new association management company, many duplicate and nonvalid records were addressed.




ASATT recognizes two certifications:




2022 MEMBERSHIP POPULATION BY **GEOGRAPHY & REGIONAL TERRITORIES**










